1.Objectives

The course aims to address the following issues:

- making progress in and improving PhD research
- deepening knowledge on methods and academic research skills
- ensuring the relevance and feasibility of research questions
- · marrying approaches and methods
- organising materials and triangulation
- ensuring structure and purpose combine to create a successful argument
- discussing and working on PhD thesis in cooperation with fellow students

2. Prerequisites

The targeted audience are PhD students of the University of Cologne and beyond. The students should hold at least a Master degree (or equivalent).

3. Relevance for study programmes

The course is open for CGS-students, doctoral students of related studies of the Faculty of Management, Economics and Social Sciences and the Faculty of Arts and Humanities of the University of Cologne as well as external participants.

4. Registration

Participation in the course must be registered in advance. The deadline for application is 30 April 2012. The course is recommended to be chosen in combination with "EXACT Seminar on Academic Qualification Skills". The size of the course is limited to 20 students. The course will take place as an intensive seminar (Blockseminar) between September 15 and 21 from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. in room S 24 and S 26.

5. Contents

- Design, relevance and feasibility of research questions
- Competing and complementary approaches to social science research











- Theories of Political Science and its sub-field, e.g. International Relations and European Integration
- Promise and limits of qualitative and quantitative data analysis
- Discussion of research and PhD projects of the participants incl. individual feedback sessions and cross-reading of chapters

6. Working requirements and assessment method

Students are requested to submit a draft chapter of their thesis prior to the seminar. Additionally, they will be requested to give an oral presentation. In the end of the seminar an oral and/or written examination will take place.
